One example is coffee hour: some people have not been in charge of refreshments, but they might be on the Board or service leader or on a committee that takes much of their free time. There are individuals who need to have a quiet time Sunday Morning to reflect, relax and renew themselves.

I am completing my second year on the Board of Trustees. I agreed to be on the Board because

I could see that there was no line-up of members anxious to take on these responsibilities. I have been a member of this congregation since the early 1980s, been in charge of the children for a 15 year period, and had a turn on the Board. I am a person who doesn't like conflict. I was hoping the whole community would participate in Non-Violent Communication training so that all of us would be better to communicate our needs and wishes and better hear others of a different point of view.
